Getting started supplies

Paper (neutral, colored, designer, vellum)

Stamp set

Paper cutter

Ink (basic black, colored)

Adhesive (different varieties)

Ribbon, buttons, brads, eyelets, tags, glitter, wire, hardware, crimper, paper piercing, various hole punches, etc.
